

As folks may know, this past December Tacoma's Lincoln Business District



2022 JAPANESE AMERICAN DAY OF REMEMBRANCE

UNIVERSITY OF PUGET SOUND

FEBRUARY 16, 2022

An estimated 120,000 Japanese residents were sent to incarceration centers throughout the West as a result of Executive Order 9066 signed by President Franklin Roosevelt. In Washington state alone, nearly 13,000 were forcibly removed from their homes and communities—including 36 students from University of Puget Sound.

Sites of Shame is a revamped interactive mapping application of the nearly one hundred sites in which Japanese Americans were incarcerated during World War II. It was produced by Densho, a Seattle-based non-profit dedicated to the online documentation of Japanese American wartime incarceration and in applying the lessons of the incarceration to promote equity today.
