IPE 350 The Political Economy of Gender and Sexuality in China

Professor Yige Dong, Barnett Chair of Contemporary China Studies, will offer a new course for Spring 2020: IPE 350.

While scholarship on the political economy of contemporary China is usually focused on the regime's economic institutions in relation to its political processes, this course invites students to use analytical tools in political economy to examine some understudied yet important issues in the field: family, gender, and sexuality since the beginning of the People's Republic (1949) to the present.

Professor Ameera Nimjee will offer a new course for Spring 2020: MUS 321.

The course explores some of the music traditions that hail from South Asia - a region defined by the countries of India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Nepal, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Afghanistan, Maldives, and their diasporas. The course studies music and some of its inextricably linked forms of dance and theater through the lens of ethnomusicology, where music is studied with respect to its complex intersections with culture, daily life, and society.
