Harold Moss Bridge Dedication

On October 1st, the City of Tacoma dedicated the East 34th Street Bridge after Harold Moss. He has long ties to the University of Puget Sound community and was the recipient of an honorary degree, Doctor of Laws, in 2009.

Harold became Tacoma's first black City Council member in 1970, first black mayor in 1994, and first black member of the Pierce County Council in 1966. The citation transcript for Harold can be found online at the following
