NOTES:

- 1) Six units of either Greek or Latin OR five units of study in one language and two units in the other language. Note that Greek or Latin 301 may be repeated for credit.
- 2) One additional Classical Civilization course, numbered 299 or above, from the following list: ARTH 360, 361; CLSC 304, 308, 309, 310, 311, 318, 325, 334, 339, 375, 390; CONN 377; PHIL 215, 361; PHYS 299; PG 340.
- 3) Senior thesis (CLSC 490) to be taken after both the required 200-level Classical Civilization courses and Greek or Latin 201 (or their equivalents) have been completed. In the semester prior to registration for CLSC 490, students must complete a Thesis Proposal Form and submit it for approval to their thesis advisor and the Classics Chair.
- 4) Of the three units of upper division coursework required outside the first major, the Connections course will count for one unless it is used to meet a major requirement.

Students considering applying to graduate school in Classics or a related field should consult with a member of the Classics faculty as soon as possible. Such students are strongly encouraged to choose the Language track and to take additional units of Greek and Latin.

Six units of either Greek or Latin OR five units of study in one language (Greek or Latin 301 may be repeated for credit) and two units in the other.

**One additional course in Classical Civilization, numbered 299 or above from the following list: ARTH 360, 361; CLSC 304, 308, 309, 310, 311, 318, 325, 334, 339, 375, 390; CONN 377; PHIL 215, 361; PHYS 299; PG 340.

***CLSC 490 to be taken after both the required 200-level Classical Civilization courses and Greek or Latin 201(or their equivalents) have been completed. In the semester prior to registration for CLSC 490, students must complete a Thesis Proposal Form and submit it for approval to their thesis advisor and the Classics Chair. For more information on the thesis and the approval process, contact the Classics Chair.

Since the Greek or Latin Language track requires at least 5 terms of Greek or Latin, students must normally begin language study by first semester sophomore year to complete the major in their fourth year. Students entering Puget Sound with some Latin or Greek should consult with the department about placement and adjustments to major requirements. At least five units in the major must be completed at Puget Sound.

Students considering applying to graduate school in Classics or a related field should consult with a member of the Classics faculty as soon as possible. Such students are strongly encouraged to choose the Language track and to take additional units of Greek and Latin.
