The Center for Writing, Learning, and Teaching (CWLT) offers numerous academic support services for Puget Sound students and faculty members.

Resources

Writing Advisors who are selected through a rigorous application process and are specially trained to help students get started on a paper, organize their thoughts, or improve their editing skills.

Subject Tutors in a wide range of subjects who are nominated by professors in their disciplines and are specially trained to help students individually or in small groups.

Peer Academic Consultants to help students develop effective strategies for studying and time management.

Language Partners who work with multi-lingual students to help them navigate the conventions and quirks of academic English writing.

Classes that help students improve their reading efficiency.

Workshops on writing personal statements for graduate and professional school applications.

Resources for writers, including books and handouts on writing, as well as the style manuals for APA, MLA, and Chicago.

Computers for students to use when writing papers and online assignments.

Teaching and learning resources for faculty members, including books and journals, "Wednesday at 4" conversations, in-class workshops, and individual consultation with CWLT faculty.

Events such as the Long Night Against Procrastination, Pi Day, the Drop-in Derby, and the Writing Marathon.
