“A”: French Literary Studies (See Bulletin for more information) 2 units at the 300-level or above in French, taken at the Tacoma campus.

“B”: French Cultural Studies - Choose French Focus or Francophone Focus (See Bulletin for more information) 4 units (one unit taken abroad may be considered).

“C”: French and the Arts. Choose the Art, Music, or Media Theatre Studies Focus (See Bulletin for more information) 3-4 units each.

“D”: French and Comparative Literature (See Bulletin for more information) 3 units.

#Please consult department advisor and transfer evaluator for appropriate classes while abroad. Exceptions to the semester study abroad requirement may be made on a case-by-case basis in a petition to the department and in consultation with a department academic advisor.

**Majors are required to compile an ePortfolio of their work and a senior paper, submitted to the department by April 15 of their senior year.

***Of the three units of upper division coursework required outside the first major, the Connections course will count for one unless it is used to meet a major requirement.

NOTES

A minimum grade of C is required in all courses counted toward the major.

*Two additional units at the 300 level and above, one of which must be at the 400 level. At least one of these courses must be taken on the Tacoma campus during the senior year.

**Choose one option for an elective Emphasis below:

“A”: French Literary Studies (2 units).

”B”: French Cultural Studies; French Focus OR Francophone Focus (4 units; one unit taken abroad may be considered).

“C”: French and the Arts; choose to Focus in one of three areas - Art, Music, or Media and Theater Studies (3-4 units each).

“D”: French and Comparative Literature (3 units).

French Language and Literature majors are required to submit a portfolio and a senior paper to satisfy graduation requirements for the major.

#Exceptions to the semester study abroad requirement may be made on a case-by-case basis in a petition to the department and in consultation with a department academic advisor. Language-intensive replacements may include a year living in a French theme house, intensive summer study, etc.

##When students declare a French Studies major, they should seek a faculty advisor in the department who will advise them on the creation of an ePortfolio of their work; submitted to the department by April 15 of their senior year.
