*These courses also require students to register for the corresponding lab section.

- 1) The one additional Theatre Arts Major Elective such as Playwriting or Projects in Dramaturgy; requirement may include MUS 220 or BUS 380.
- 2) THTR 371 and 373 may be taken at any point after taking a World Theatre class (THTR 250, 252, 254, or 256). The junior year is recommended, but the courses may be taken in the sophomore or senior years.
- 3) Of the three units of upper division coursework required outside the first major, the Connections course will count for one unit unless it is used to meet a major requirement.
- 4) Students wishing to continue into the MAT program or teacher certification for any level of instruction should take EDUC 419 and 420 as electives during their undergraduate coursework. Students who wish to pursue certification to teach at the middle school or high school level can major in theatre but also need at least a minor in a certification area like English, History, or Math. Double majoring in those areas may be a good strategy. For elementary certification a theatre major on its own is sufficient.
