



University of Puget Sound Women's League Scholarships 2019-20 Academic Year

The Women's League at Puget Sound was formed in 1900 to support the university. The largest fund-raising event each year is the Flea Market, held in the spring at Memorial Fieldhouse. Proceeds from the Market are divided evenly between the Women's League 3 endowed scholarship funds:

The Thompson Scholarship - In 1974, the Dr. Franklin & Lucille Thompson Scholarship was established to honor Dr. Franklin and Lucille Thompson. Dr. Franklin Thompson was president of Puget Sound for 31 years, from 1942 to 1973. His wife, Lucille Thompson, was very involved in the Women's League. She served in nearly every officer position and helped the League make contributions to each of the buildings which were built during her husband's presidency. Up to four \$2,750 Thompson Scholarships will be awarded to sophomores or juniors who demonstrate academic merit, financial need, and participate in extracurricular activities.

The Women's League Scholarship - Established in 1982 to provide scholarships to students with financial need. Up to four \$3,500 scholarships will be awarded to students with junior class standing who demonstrate academic merit, financial need, and participate in extracurricular activities.

The Centennial Scholarship Fund - Established in 1987 in recognition of the Centennial of the university. Awards are made to female students who demonstrate financial need. First preference is given to women who are over the age of 35 and are from the Pierce County area.
