- 1) ARTS 101 and 102 satisfy the Artistic Approaches (AR) core. Students who plan to major in studio art and need to take ARTS 101 or 102 should contact the instructor prior to registration week.
- 2) Three art history courses; Any two from ARTH 275*, 276, 278, or 325; one additional course from the following: ARTH 302, 325, 349, 359-363, 365, 367-371, 380, 399; HUM 330; LAS 387. ARTH 325 may only be counted once. *Honors students may take HON 206 as a substitute for ARTH 275.
- 3) Choose from either ARTS 247 or 248.
- 4) ARTS 355 is taken in tandem with ARTS 455. If you take ARTS 355 during your junior year, it is strongly recommended to enroll in ARTS 455 your senior year. If you do not enroll in ARTS 355 during your junior year, you may take it in your senior year.
- 5) Of the three units of upper division coursework required outside the first major, the Connections course will count for one unless it is used to meet a major requirement.
