NOTES:

The Classics and Ancient Mediterranean Studies department offers **two tracks** for its major: Classical Languages and Classical Studies. This is the suggested four-year program for a Classical Studies major (See separate curriculum guide for the Classical Languages major). **Students who are considering graduate school in Classics should choose the Classical Languages track rather than the Classical Studies track and consult with a member of the faculty as soon as possible about taking additional units of Greek and Latin.**

Three courses in either Greek or Latin are required, but students with appropriate background may begin at a higher level.

Completion of 2 semesters (0.5 units) of CLSC 100 (proseminar) activity credit.

Three additional courses, at least two of which must be numbered 299+, in Greek, or Latin, or the following Classical Civilization courses: ARTH 360, 361; CLSC 130, 210, 211, 212, 230-233, 280, 309, 310, 320-323, 330, 339, 375; CONN 377; PHIL 215, 361; PHYS 299; PG 340; SOAN 280.

- 1) Greek or Latin 301 may be repeated for credit.
- 2) Of the three units of upper division coursework required outside the first major, the Connections course will count for one unless it is used to meet a major requirement.
- 3) Senior thesis (CLSC 490). In the semester prior to registration for CLSC 490, students must complete a Thesis Proposal form and submit it for approval to their thesis advisor and the Department Chair. Contact the Department Chair for more information on the thesis/approval process.
- 4) At least five units in the major must be completed at Puget Sound.

**Three additional courses, two of which must be at the 299+ level, in Greek, or Latin, or the following list of Classical Civilization courses: ARTH 360, 361; CLSC 130, 210, 211, 212, 230-233, 280, 309, 310, 320-323, 330, 339, 375; CONN 377; PHIL 215, 361; PHYS 299; PG 340; SOAN 280.

***Two semesters of CLSC 100 Proseminar (activity credit; 0.25 units each).

At least five units in the major must be completed at Puget Sound.

#CLSC 490 to be taken after both the required 200-level Classical Civilization courses and Greek or Latin 201(or their equivalents) have been completed. In the semester prior to registration for CLSC 490, students must complete a Thesis Proposal form and submit it for approval to their thesis advisor and the Department Chair. Contact the Department Chair for more information on the thesis/approval process.

Classical Studies Majors may meet no more than one unit of their Classical Studies requirements with coursework from a minor or second major. Majors may satisfy no more than one Classical Studies requirement with coursework from the university core.

Students who are considering graduate school in Classics should choose the Classical Languages track rather than the Classical Studies track and consult with a member of the faculty as soon as possible about taking additional units of Greek and Latin.
