Language-intensive replacements may include a year living in a French theme house, intensive summer study, etc.
- ##Seniors must work with their advisor in the French and Francophone Studies department to create an ePortfolio about their progress in the curriculum and total experience as a major; to be submitted to the department by April 15 of senior year.
- ###All French Literary Studies majors must submit a senior paper to the department by April 15 of their senior year. Details available on the department homepage.
