Students must earn a grade of C (2.0) or above in all courses taken 101 a major or minor in the German Studies Department.

- 1) Can be substituted by units from the successful completion of higher level German courses.
- 2) Satisfies Humanistic Approaches core requirement.
- 3) At least four additional units from the following: GERM 300, 305, 310, 315, 365, 395, 420, 450, 480; CONN 330, 333; HIST 224, 317, 320, 322, 325, 335; P&G 321. At least one of these units, but no more than two units, must come from GEM or CONN 330.
- 4) At least one semester in an immersion study abroad program in Germany, Austria, or Switzerland (with one year strongly recommended) or on a program in an Eastern European country that includes courses in the foreign language at some level (including Elementary). See bulletin for additional options if financial or personal circumstances preclude a student from studying abroad.
- \*Of the three units of upper division coursework required outside the first major, the Connections course will count for one unless it is used to meet a major requirement.
- \*\*A senior paper to be completed during a seminar course (GERM 400+) in senior year.
- \*\*\*Due April 1 of senior year. Student to seek guidance from a Faculty Advisor on creating a portfolio as soon as they declare their major.

## Students must earn a grade of C (2.0) or above in all courses taken for a major or minor in the German Studies Department.

- \*Must demonstrate proficiency in elementary and intermediate German by completing GERM 101-102 and GERM 201-202 or by successful completion of higher level German courses.
- \*\*Four additional units from the following: GERM 300, 305, 310, 315, 365, 395, 420, 450, 480; CONN 330, 333; HIST 224, 317, 320, 322, 325, 335; P&G 321. Two of these units must be taken during the senior year and include one upper-level GERM seminar (400+; conducted in German) and one HIST 300+ seminar course (or CONN 333). No more than two units can be from German.
- \*\*\*Senior paper to be completed during a seminar course (GERM 400+ or HIST 300+).
- #At least one semester in an immersion study abroad program in Germany, Austria, or Switzerland (with one year strongly recommended). See Bulletin for additional options if financial or personal circumstances preclude a student from studying abroad).
- \*\*\*\*Majors are required to compile a portfolio of their work, submitted to the department by April 1 of their senior year.
