- 1) The three Intermediate Level PHIL requirements (courses listed on back) must be completed by the end of junior year.
- 2) Students can take one additional Specialist-Level course instead of one of the four required Advanced-Level courses (Specialist and Advanced-Level courses listed on back).
- 3) Of the three units of upper division coursework required outside the first major, the Connections course will count for one unless it is used to meet a major requirement.

*No more than two courses of the 10 units required for a Philosophy major can be satisfied with courses numbered 199 or below.

Level Requirements:

- 1) Intermediate Level: Three of the following courses: PHIL 210#, 220, 230, 240##, 250; All intermediate level courses should be completed by end of the Junior year. #Satisfies the HM core; ##Satisfies the MA core.
- 2) Advanced Level: At least four courses numbered 300–399*; two of which must be completed on campus; *satisfies KNOW requirement.
- 3) Specialist Level: At least one of the following courses: PHIL 410, 430, or 450 (each may be repeated for credit with instructor permission).

#Students can take one additional Specialist Level Course (410-450) in lieu of a fourth Advanced course.

Area Requirements:

History and Traditions: At least two of PHIL 210#, 220, 310, 311, 312, 320, 323, 325.

Knowledge and Reality: At least two of PHIL 230, 240##, 330, 331, 332, 333, 336.

Value Theory: At least two of PHIL 250, 285, 286, 292, 350, 353, 360, 370, 378, 389*, 390*. *Satisfies KNOW requirement.

Only two courses may be used simultaneously to satisfy core curriculum and the Philosophy Department's requirements.

Intermediate level requirements should be completed by the end of the junior year.
