Math & CS Review (WG4, report attached)

- Reviewed concerns in report- staffing, rec. retaining their 420 course, syllabi content issues
- WG4 supports acceptance

Chemistry Review (WG3, report attached)

- Some CC members voiced concerns over the pressures faculty faced due to heavy teaching loads and what seems to be an apparent need for more tenure line Chemistry faculty.

- WG2 members comment on the strength and initiative of the program and their positive impact on our campus and nationally, however, that limitations in tenure line faculty positions (no dedicated faculty line currently exists) challenge their continued sustainability, growth and future impact
- CC notes the growth and interests in expanding this curriculum and agrees with the demonstrated need for additional tenure line faculty
- CC also acknowledges that GQS-inspired SIM requests have increased as a demonstration of student interest in establishing a major in GQS studies

Academic Calendar Year concerns from Registrar

- Fall semester grade due guidelines designate Jan 6, 2020. Because the fall semester start date is relatively later in Fall 2019, this causes a relatively later grade due deadline based upon the scheduling guidelines.
- Jan 2nd grade due deadline is requested to allow for administrative time needed for Registrar functions related to decisions and processes regarding student sanction/dismissal (and potential for their retention) and the functions related to Academic Advising
- Discussed the potential pitfalls for faculty and ways to facilitate communication with faculty so adjustments can be made in course planning as it relates to grading issues
