Overview of application numbers and budget situation given the number of applications

OIP received 74 applications for study abroad for Fall and 101 for Spring. Those numbers are slightly lower than last year's figures (84 applications for Fall and 99 for Spring). OIP is strategically planning and is expecting that its budget will support all of the students meeting the requirements for study abroad. OIP is also taking into account the fact that each year several students who have applications approved decide not to go abroad. Last year, OIP recorded a melt of 13% for Fall and 27% for Spring. The faculty noted that students withdrew for a variety of reasons: financial, personal, or simply because they do not wish to miss campus activities. During the next IEC meeting OIP will present a chart summarizing its statistics.
