*Of the two additional FREN 300+ courses, one must be at the 400+ level and one must be taken at the Tacoma campus during the senior year.

1) Only one of FREN 300 or 310 may count toward the French Comparative Literature major.

2) Of the three units of upper division coursework required outside the first major, the Connections course will count for one unless it is used to meet a major requirement.

3) Three units from courses in the following Literatures: American, English, German, or Hispanic, to be determined in consultation with a department academic advisor.

#Study abroad must be completed in a French speaking country where French is the language of instruction. Exceptions to the semester study abroad requirement may be made on a case-by-case basis in a petition to the department and in consultation with a department academic advisor. Language-intensive replacements may include a year living in a French theme house, intensive summer study, etc.

##Seniors must work with their advisor in the French and Francophone Studies department to create an ePortfolio about their progress in the curriculum and total experience as a major; to be submitted to the department by April 15 of senior year.

###All French Comparative Literature majors must submit a senior paper to the department by April 15 of their senior year. Details available on the department homepage.
