\*Philosophy majors must complete at least 10 units in Philosophy (excludes courses 480 and higher and no more than two at 199 or below) and adhere to both Level (Intermediate, Advanced, or Specialist) and Area Requirements (History and Tradition, Knowledge and Reality, and Value Theory).

- 1) Intermediate Level requirements (courses listed on back) are to be completed by the end of junior year.
- 2) Students can take one additional Specialist-Level course instead of one of the four required Advanced-Level courses (Specialist and Advanced-Level courses listed on back).
- 3) Of the three units of upper division coursework required outside the first major, the Connections course will count for one unless it is used to meet a major requirement.

#### NOTES

\*At least 10 units in Philosophy, excluding courses numbered 480+; no more than two courses numbered 199 or below.

**Level Requirements:**

- 1) Intermediate Level - Three of the following courses: PHIL 210, 220, 230, 240, 250; All intermediate level courses should be completed by end of the Junior year.
- 2) Advanced Level - At least four courses numbered 300–399; two of which must be completed on campus.
- 3) Specialist Level - At least one of the following courses: PHIL 410, 430, or 450.

#Students can take one additional Specialist Level Course (410-450) in lieu of a fourth Advanced course.

**Area Requirements:**

*History and Traditions:* At least two of PHIL 210, 220, 310, 311, 320, 323, 335.

*Knowledge and Reality:* At least two of PHIL 230, 240, 330, 331, 332, 336

*Value Theory:* At least two of PHIL 250, 285, 292, 350, 353, 360, 370, 378, 389, 390.

Only two courses may be used simultaneously to satisfy core curriculum and the Philosophy Department's requirements.

Courses taken more than six years ago will be accepted or rejected for the major by the Philosophy Department on a case-by-case basis.
