## Committee on Diversity Minutes

October 11, 2011

The meeting was called to order at 8:04. The minutes of Sept. 28 were approved (with minor modification on the spelling of one committee member's name).

## Announcements:

Diversity Breakfast was successful (Amy Ryken and Kim Bobbi)

## Climate Survey:

Amy read a few written statements from the survey. Those responding to the survey perceived the Puget Sound community to be <u>generally</u> supportive. Conversely, respondents felt less supported with regard to their <u>individual</u> identities. Some respondents reported incidents of harassment for political views (particularly conservative viewpoints), sexuality and ethnicity. There are increased reports of sexual harassment (male to female) among students.

## Cultural Competence:

The committee continued its discussion of the document "What Is Cultural Competence?" Specifically, the committee looked carefully at the Cultural Competence: Awareness, Knowledge, Skills, and Advocacy survey forms. The committee discussed ways to improve the four-part form. Some suggestions for improving the form included: (1) shorten length (to lessen respondent fatigue); (2) edit for redundancy; (3) edit for consistency across four categories; (4) edit for clarity of word choice; and, (5) clarification of some terms, such as "nonverbal expression." Amy suggested combining some of the boxes in the Skills section; Czarina suggested that the phrase "change agent" be changed to "advocacy."

As discussion of Cultural Competency continued, Zaixin raised a question about "unconventional" people. A conversation ensued about the tensions between community standards and individualism. Zaixin also wondered why the committee was not using the word "tolerant" in the survey form. Czarina provided a history of the cultural usage of the word and its perceived limitations.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:50.
