Business: The committee reviewed the goals of the committee and discussed responsibilities and charges likely to be assigned for the year including: Planning for the new residence hall, implementation of the two year residential requirement, renovations to Wheelock Student Center, and development of initiatives related to campus culture for underrepresented students. Dean Segawa mentioned that the issue of student retention is now shifted to Ellen Peters in institutional research.

Dean Segawa shared information about the goals of the new building, particularly the integration of scholarship with daily living. He previewed some of the programming in place for students returning from study abroad, and outlined plans for four other academic programs that will have homes in the new facility.

The committee discussed the interface between academic co-curricular facets of the Puget Sound experience and ways to best convey that integration through varied media.

Student representatives were encouraged to take an active role in the committee. Assoc. Dean Ferrari emphasized the value of students on the committee, and their status as peers in discussion as well as voting.
