# CURRICULUM COMMITTEE MINUTES 

31 October 2008 (Friday)

Call to order: Acting Chair Grunberg called the meeting to order at 8:03.
Opening remarks: There were no opening remarks.
Announcements: There were no announcements.
Approval of Minutes of September 12, 2008: The minutes of the October 3, 2008 meeting were approved as written.

## Ratification of Calendar:

The detailed calendar for the 2009 - 2010 academic year, and the general calendars for 2010 - 2011, 2011 - 2012, and 2012 - 2013 academic years had been distributed in advance to members of the Committee, and are attached to these minutes as appendices A - D.

Brazell reviewed the academic calendars. In response to a question, Tomhave noted that open registration ends on Thursday in the 2009-2010 calendar to help advisors of first year students know what classes would be available for first-year registration.

Loeb M/S/P approval of the detailed calendar for the 2009 - 2010 academic year and the general calendars for the 2010-2011, 2011 - 2012, and 2012 - 2013 academic years.

In further discussion, Walls asked about the difference in the number of days in the Fall term and in the Spring term. Brazell noted that the length of terms is set in the document titled Guidelines for Setting Academic Calendar.

## Reports of working groups:

## Working Group 1

Lamb reported that no work had been received for Working Group 1

## Working Group 2:

Loeb, reporting for Working Group 2 said that the working group had met with the Comparative Sociology Department and M/S/P to approve the Comparative Sociology Department Curriculum Review.

## Working Group 3:

Hamel reported that Working Group 3 was working on the School of Music Curriculum Review.

## Working Group 4:

Richards reported that the International Political Economy Curriculum Review was progressing.

## Working Group 5:

Kotsis reported that both the review of proposal for the Special Interdisciplinary Major (SIM) were in progress, as the Asian Studies Curriculum Review.

Brazell reminded working groups that DeMarais should be advised of all working group meetings. She also asked that syllabi from earlier reviews be returned to the Office of the Associate Deans.

## Comments on Chapter 2 of the reaccreditation document

Moore opened the discussion on chapter 2 of the reaccreditation document distributed earlier. She asked the Committee to identify broad issues that emerge from the self-study, and to note particularly the changes in the last decade.

Walls asked who was responsible for the document. Moore replied that the Reaccreditation Committee (Jay Becker (Facilities Services), Debbie Chee (student affairs), Jo Crane (chemistry), Alyce DeMarais (accreditation liaison officer), Theresa Duhart (information services), Janet Hallman (Accounting and Budget Services), Grace Kirchner (education), Maggie Mittuch (Student Financial Services), Sarah Moore (associate academic dean), Randy Nelson (institutional research), Eric Orlin (classics), Lori Ricigliano (Collins Memorial Library), Jack Roundy (academic advising), Zach Street (admission), and Carolyn Weisz (psychology) had prepared the document. Walls then asked about the next step. What do we do about the remaining issues?

Kotsis, noting the Senior Survey question "Appreciate the arts" (Table 2.4: HED Senior Survey Results) that the Art Department does not teach art appreciation, but rather the contextual analysis of the arts.

The issue of foreign languages was raised, with several noting that one year of foreign language was not sufficient for the study of a foreign language. The fact that perhaps $40 \%$ of our students study abroad at some point in their academic career was noted (The Secretary checked with Jannie Meisberger, director of International Programs, who reported that the figure for students graduating last academic year was 43\%). Hooper reminded the Committee that this issue had been raised before, and that a stronger foreign language requirement had been rejected. Matthews concurred with the need for more foreign language, but noted that the problems of staffing additional foreign language courses was an important issue.

Moore asked what the purpose of a strengthened foreign language requirement would be. Kotsis suggested that we look at different models for teaching a foreign language, perhaps involving a more focused set of language courses at the 100-200 level taught by adjunct faculty perhaps including local graduate students from other institutions. Hooper suggested that the issue of a foreign language requirement needs to be revisited and agreed with Moore that the objectives of the requirement have not been clearly defined.

Loeb suggested that the document was dense, and that perhaps it should be passed on in bits to the working groups. Moore replied that the document is due in December, and the purpose of this session was to note things that needed to be added or corrected. The document will be read by colleagues in a variety of disciplines, who may concentrate on issues identified as problems in earlier evaluations.

The Committee commended the Reaccreditation Committee for the document before it and for the quality of the Reaccreditation Committee's work.

Moore asked that any further comments be sent to Alyce DeMarais, Lisa Ferrari, or to herself.

## Adjournment

McCuistion moved that we adjourn, and we did adjourn at 8:40.
