Library, Media, and Computing Committee (LMAC) Minutes October 30, 2003

- 1. The minutes of the meeting on September 11, 2003, were approved to great acclaim.
- 2. Agenda items for the next meeting include collection development and paper versus electronic journals.
- 3. Karen Fischer, Library Director, has instituted a campus-wide trial of RefWorks citation and bibliographic software in order to determine if there is sufficient faculty interest to warrant purchasing a subscription. Peter Greenfield will send an e-mail notifying faculty of this trial, which runs from October 27-November 27. There will be a demonstration by a RefWorks representative on November 13 from 2:00-4:00 in Library 118 (drop in & leave as needed).
- 4. Elizabeth Knight, Science Liaison Librarian, demonstrated RefWorks and discussed its benefits:
- · It is web based; anyone in the campus community can access it.
- · Support is done by RefWorks; UPS librarians do not have to support it and edit the filters
- It is designed for undergraduate students.
- One can import EndNote information into RefWorks.
- Go to www.refworks.com and select "user login" to begin using RefWorks.
- 5. RefWorks makes it easier to cite books, articles, websites, etc., properly. Karen Fischer compares it to students using calculators in math courses -- once students learn to do this work by hand, this tool allows them to create citations and bibliographies quickly and in the correct format.
- 6. The Write-N-Cite feature allows easy creation of citations and bibliography (in Microsoft Word documents) in specified styles (Chicago, MLA, etc.).
- 7. The next LMAC meeting will be Thursday, November 13, 2003, from 10:30-11:30.
