## New Business:

The Curriculum Committee's proposed revision of Question 6 of the Curriculum Review Guidelines was introduced for discussion. Discussion of the proposed new wording ensued. Members of the CoD are concerned the proposed new wording will not adequately support departments and programs in a deliberate consideration of diversity in the curriculum and in hiring and retention of faculty. This discussion lead to the following recommendation for wording of Question 6:

M/S/P (unanimous) "How does your department, school, or program engage the university's Diversity Statement in regard to curriculum, pedagogy, retention of students, and recruitment and retention of faculty?"

The suggested revision is to be forwarded to the Curriculum Committee and Senate for their consideration along with a memo from the CoD chair outlining our position and willingness to meet with the Curriculum Committee to discuss this issue.

The Committee spent the remainder of the meeting discussing the Senate's charge to identify areas of concern for the faculty based on a review of faculty responses to the campus climate survey and make recommendations to the senate. The CoD will revisit this charge at our next meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:00 pm.
