

**Faculty Diversity Committee Minutes
April 10, 1998**

The meeting began at 4:00 pm. The minutes from the previous meeting were approved as written.

Announcements:

A lengthy discussion of the rough draft of the Committee's Final Report ensued. Curriculum assessment and curriculum transformation sections were proposed.

Patti Krueger will see if the publication Diversity Works is available on campus.

George Guilmet will review the publication Core Curriculum and Cultural Pluralism to see what kinds of issues should be mentioned in the Final Report.

A discussion of the intent of the Committee with respect to a possible pluralism component of the Core Curriculum unfolded. This discussion is to be continued in the next meeting.
