Professional Standards Committee Minutes March 14, 1997

The Committee drafted the following statement concerning procedures for when a conflict of interest may exist:

In cases brought before the Professional Standard Committee (PSC), the individuals involved or any PSC member may raise the issue of conflict of interest concerning a member of the Committee. If the conflict of interest is disputed, those members of the PSC who are not involved in the alleged conflict of interest shall conduct a confidential, written vote to determine if a conflict of interest exists. If it is determined that a member of the PSC does have a conflict of interest, that member shall be recused from deliberating and voting. If a member of the PSC is recused because of a conflict of interest, the PSC, at its discretion, may appoint a substitute to participate in the case.

The Committee forwarded the statement to the Faculty Senate for consideration for inclusion in Article 5, Section 6E of the Faculty Bylaws.
