Purpose

To encourage and reward good writing in all disciplines at the University of Puget Sound.

Eligibility

Any paper (but no outlines or notes) submitted as part of the requirements for courses at Puget Sound is eligible. Shorter papers are as likely to win as longer ones. Papers from courses taken in **Spring 2023, Summer 2023, or Fall 2023** will be considered.
