

Campus Hazing Transparency Report

In accordance with the Stop Campus Hazing Act and Sam's Law [RCW 28B.10.900], Puget Sound summarizes findings of any established or recognized student organization¹ found to be in violation of hazing as outlined in the <u>Policy Prohibiting Hazing</u>. The report will not include any personal or identifying information of individual students.

As of August 2022 the University of Puget Sound does not have any findings of violations to report. The University will maintain reports for five years and post reports on January 15th and July 15th of each academic year. Investigations that do not result in a finding of formal violation of the Policy Prohibiting Hazing will not be included in the report.

¹ A student organization is defined as an organization at an institution of higher education (such as a club, society, association, varsity or junior varsity athletic team, club sports team, fraternity, sorority, band, or student government) in which two or more of the members are students enrolled at the institution of higher education, whether or not the organization is established or recognized by the institution.
