Important Immigration Reminder -Preparing for Holiday travel? If you are planning to travel out of the country for one of the holidays, please make sure that you have a VALID TRAVEL SIGNATURE from Sally on the last page of your I-20. A valid signature means that the signature must be current in the last year. Please note that if you don't have a current travel signature while traveling abroad, you might not be able to get back into the country when you return. I am scheduled to leave campus on the 16th of December when I travel to France to help my daughter restore her 300 year old farmhouse outside of Rennes. Please make sure you get travel signatures before December 16th.

International Student Insurance: I have provided a link on the webpage and in the newsletter for your <u>international student health insurance</u>. Here you can print new cards if you lost yours, check your policy and coverage details download and print claim forms. If you need answers to routine health questions and middle of the night questions, check the **MyNurse 24/7** line on the Lewer website.
