

- 2) Three art history electives; any two courses from ARTH 275*, 276, or 278 and one additional course from: ARTH 302, 325, 359-363, 365, 367-371, 380, 399; HUM 330, 335; LAS 387. *Honors students may take HON 206 as a substitute for ARTH 275.

ARTH 275*, 276, 278, 302 may be used to meet the Artistic Approaches core.

- 3) ARTS 347 is taken in tandem with ARTS 447. If you take ARTS 347 during your junior year, it is strongly recommended to enroll in ARTS 447 your senior year. If you do not enroll in ARTS 347 during your junior year, you may take it during your senior year.
- 4) Of the three units of upper division coursework required outside the first major, the Connections course will count for one unless it is used to meet a major requirement.

NOTES

Students majoring in Studio Art must earn a GPA of 2.0 in courses taken for the major and all courses taken for a major must be taken for graded credit.

A limited number of seats have been reserved in ARTS 101 and 102 for prospective studio art majors. Students who plan to major in studio art and wish to take one of these courses should contact the instructor prior to registration week.

*ARTS 347 is taken in tandem with ARTS 447. If you take ARTS 347 during your junior year, it is strongly recommended to enroll in ARTS 447 your senior year. If you do not enroll in ARTS 347 during your junior year, you may take it during your senior year.

#Two courses from: ARTH 275*, 276, 278. *HON 206 may only be taken by Honors students and is a replacement for ARTH 275. ##One course from the following: ARTH 302, 325, 359-363, 365, 367-371, 380, 399; HUM 330, 335; LAS 387.

Elective units are available in art and art-related fields, which provide concentration, depth, and choices for the art major in ceramics, drawing, history, painting, printmaking, and sculpture.

Sophomore orientation is highly recommended.
