- *Students must submit a graded substantial ARTH research paper (at least 10 pages in length) by the end of their junior year for midlevel evaluation.

- Elective units are available in art and art-related fields, which provide concentration, depth, and choices for the art major in painting, ceramics, drawing, printmaking, history and sculpture.
