- 3) Choose from either ARTS 281 OR 282 required. ARTS 281 offered Fall semester; ARTS 282 offered Spring semester.
- 4) ARTS 350 is taken in tandem with ARTS 450. If you take ARTS 350 during your junior year, it is strongly recommended to enroll in ARTS 450 your senior year. If you do not enroll in ARTS 350 during your junior year, you may take it during your senior year.
- 5) Of the three units of upper division coursework required outside the first major, the Connections course will count for one unless it is used to meet a major requirement.
