- 6) Of the three units of upper division coursework required outside the first major, the Connections course will count for one.

\*\*\*\*An International experience which may include study abroad, a formal internship abroad, or academic research abroad.

Transfer students choosing to major in the School of Business and Leadership should meet with the SBL Director to determine transferability of business courses completed elsewhere.

Students planning to pursue a graduate degree in business, such as an MBA, are encouraged to take calculus (MATH 180, 181).

A minimum of five BUS courses toward the major must be completed in residence at Puget Sound or a waiver approved.
