**NOTES:**

- 1) Six units of either Greek or Latin OR five units of study in one language and two units in the other.
- 2) Additional course in Classical Civilization, numbered 299 or above: ARTH 360, 361; CLSC 304, 308, 309, 310, 311, 318, 325, 330, 375, 390; CONN 377; PHIL 361; PHYS 299; PG 340.
- 3) Senior thesis to be taken after both the required 200-level Classical Civilization courses and Greek or Latin 201 (or their equivalents) have been completed.
- 4) Of the three units of upper division coursework required outside the first major, the Connections course will count for one unless it is used to meet a major requirement.

**Students who are considering graduate school in the subject are encouraged to take both Greek and Latin languages.**
