## NOTES

General university degree requirements apply: 1) three units of the minor be taken in residence; 2) students earn a GPA of 2.0 in courses taken for the minor; and 3) all courses taken for a minor must be taken for graded credit. Refer to Bulletin for any exceptions.
The Education Studies minor requires that students complete 5.5 units to include: EDUC 419, EDUC 420, EDUC 493, any two of EDUC 290, 292, 294, 295, 296, 298 ( 0.5 units) and at least *two electives from AFAM 101, 210, 205, 346, 401, AFAM/Comm 370; ENGL 248; GQS 201; PG 304, 314, 346; PSYC 220, 221, 222, 225; REL 307, 211; SOAN 301, 305, 310, 370. Students may choose to take both courses from the same or different departments. Students are encouraged to take more than two of these elective courses as a way of broadening their perspectives on educational issues. Some of these electives will also satisfy core requirements.
