- At least one unit in the history of a preindustrial period chosen from the following: HIST 101, 230, 245, 280, 293, 302, 304, 305, 307, 311, 314, 351, 352; CONN 332; CLSC 209, 211, 212, 308, 309, 390.

First year seminars do not count toward the major.

At least five units of the major must be completed in residence at Puget Sound.

The department advises students who plan to do graduate work in African, Asian, European, or Latin American history to take at least two years of an appropriate foreign language.
