GUNNAR FOLSOM, affiliate faculty artist, percussion, is one of the Pacific Northwest's most in-demand percussionists. He is a member of Pacific Northwest Ballet Orchestra, and is a frequent substitute with Seattle Symphony, Seattle Opera, Tacoma Symphony, and Northwest Sinfonietta. As a chamber musician, he has performed with John Taverner and Tallis Scholars, Ensemble Sospeso, Seattle Chamber Players, and Festival Chamber Music Society at Merkin Hall. Mr. Folsom is a founding member of Pacific Rims, a percussion quartet based in Seattle. He is a percussion coach for Seattle Youth Symphony Orchestras, and is on the faculty of Marrowstone Musical Festival. Mr. Folsom has taught at Music Works Northwest, Marrowstone in the City, Mid-Summer Musical Retreat, and New England Music Camp in Sidney, Maine.

Mr. Folsom received his Bachelor of Music degree from University of Washington and Master of Music degree from Manhattan School of Music, where he studied with Christopher Lamb, Duncan Patton, and Don Liuzzi.
