NOTES

No more than one course may be counted both toward the major and toward the core. Prospective majors should complete all 200 level requirements (215, 219, 228, 273, and 281) by the end of the junior year.

Introductory PHIL courses, numbered between 100 and 110, do not count toward the major.

Four Philosophy electives required, three of which must be numbered 300-390 or above 400, and of these three, two must be completed on campus.

Only one course may be used simultaneously to satisfy core curriculum and the Philosophy department's requirements.
