At least 5 units of the 10 required for the major must be completed at Puget Sound.

With the prior approval of the department, one unit of PG 498 may count toward the major.

IPE upper-division and independent study courses may count toward the major with prior approval of the department.

Students who study abroad may apply two approved courses toward their PG major. Of those two courses, only one may apply to the student's area of concentration.

Students wishing to write a senior thesis can apply for entry into PG 490 (Thesis in Politics and Government) upon completion of the fall senior capstone course and fulfillment of application requirements.
